

### **TOURISM BY THE NUMBERS**

2021 was a stellar year for tourism in the Heber Valley. We saw record numbers at many of our mainstream events. Many of our outfitters, restaurants, and activities reported that they had "their best year yet". And our lodging partners had months of significantly higher revenues than previous years.

Our transient room tax (TRT) collections have been increasing since 2018, with a small decline in 2020. The average increase in

TRT collection across the state is 6%. In 2021, Wasatch County's TRT collection increased by 29% over 2020 and 18% over 2019.

We are very fortunate to call this amazing valley home. With an abundance of outdoor recreation opportunities, the accessibility, and the best restaurants in the state, we are a great option for visitors seeking refuge from the Wasatch Front, and nearby states.



### **CHAMBER GOLF TOURNAMENT**

Each year, the Chamber hosts an exciting golf tournament at one of the local and world-renowned golf courses in the valley. ### **ECONOMIC SUCCESS & GROWTH**

**Business Forum:** This was a listening event for the Chamber staff. We learned about many struggles our businesses are facing. From this event, we were able to adjust our plans to better meet our community's needs.

Rural County Grant: Wasatch County received just over \$95,000 to go towards economic development and business retention. These funds helped finance the Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) planning for Heber City, some downtown development for Midway, and destination development activities for Heber Valley.

### **ECONOMIC SNAPSHOT**

2021 was a strong year for Wasatch County.
Unemployment started at 4.4% and declined throughout the year finishing at 1.9%. Job growth in the county was strong with 6.4% growth in non-farm jobs. The major hindrance to economic success in 2021 and into 2022 will continue to be high demand for employees and ongoing tightening of the labor force.
