→ As of March 22, 2024 3:00 PM



Important Updates

- → Flood Watch Canceled for Strafford County and Coastal areas from Portland northward
- → Winter Storm Warnings expanded southward for heavy snow, sleet, and freezing rain
- → Winter Weather Advisories issued for Coastal York County and SE New Hampshire
- → Guidance has continued to trend colder with snow amounts increasing and the potential for more ice across Central New Hampshire and Coastal Interior of Maine.
- → Coastal flooding is not expected for this event
- Avalanche Watch issued for the White Mountains


Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing	Confidence
Snow	Heavy snow will cause hazardous driving conditions. Travel should be rerouted or delayed if possible.	Mountains and Foothills	Saturday	75% - High
Mixed Precipitation	Mixed precipitation will cause hazardous travel conditions due to slippery roads. Travel is not advised.	Interior	Saturday	75% - High
Ice	Ice accumulation will make for dangerous travel. Ice accumulation on weighted down tree limbs will lead to possible scattered power outages.	Interior	Saturday	50% - Moderate
Flooding	Heavy rain and snow melt will lead to areas of flooding with many road closures and minor property damage possible.	Coast	Saturday - Saturday Night	25% - Low
Wind	Fallen tree limbs and a few uprooted trees are likely. Scattered power outages are possible.	New Hampshire & Western Maine	Saturday Night - Sunday	75% - High












Storm Total Snow



- Potential heaviest snowstorm for the season in the mountains
- Amounts have increased farther south as the system has trended colder.
- Significant mixed precipitation is possible along and south of the foothills.









Snow Probabilities


Confidence of Receiving Certain Snowfall Amounts








Storm Total Ice




- A corridor of freezing rain is expected tomorrow.
- This will be a snow to sleet to freezing rain event with no freezing rain on bare pavement expected.
- Winds will increase after the freezing rain has ended.
- Biggest travel impact is expected Saturday afternoon.






Storm Total Sleet

- Sleet amounts up to 1" are possible.








Snowfall Intensity Graphics











Starting and Ending Time








Rainfall Forecast




- Flood threat will be confined to coastal areas with nuisance urban and small stream flooding.
- Rainfall rates be heaviest on Saturday afternoon.
- Any freshly fallen snow and sleet could clog drains.






Peak Wind Gusts Expected




- Wind gusts will be highest Saturday night into Sunday morning with winds from the northwest.
- Isolated power outages could be possible depending on ice and snow load on trees.
- Winds will be relatively light and from the northeast on Saturday.



Event Summary

Significant Late Winter Storm Tomorrow

Key Messages

- Heaviest snowfall for the season is possible for the interior
- Mixed precipitation and heavy snow rates tomorrow will lead to dangerous travel tomorrow

What We Are Certain Of:

- Heavy snow for the mountains
- A band of mixed precipitation will occur

What We Are Less Certain Of:

How much sleet or freezing rain will fall

**	 Heavy snow and intense snowfall rates tomorrow will lead to dangerous travel conditions. Sleet is expected to push into the foothills and will lower totals, but higher amounts could be possible.
THE PART OF THE PA	 A corridor of ice accretion is possible, but will be a snow to sleet to freezing rain event. Confidence is low for enough ice to down branches at this time.
***	 A band of mixed precipitation is certain with snow, sleet, freezing rain and a period of pure rain before changing back over to snow. Messy mix will lead to dangerous travel conditions.
	Flood threat for coastal areas looks to be minor with mostly nuisance small stream and urban flooding in low lying areas.
	 Winds during the storm will be from the northeast direction and light with gusts below 20 mph for most area. Stronger northwest winds on the backside of storm Saturday night into Sunday will strip snow and ice from trees.
