

Hot and Humid with Storms Tuesday

Primary Threat: Damaging Winds

OVERVIEW

- Hot and humid conditions will push heat index values into the mid 90s across SE NH and low 90s elsewhere
- Storms develop across NH and track east into southern ME bringing the threat of damaging winds and torrential rainfall

TIMING

Greatest storm threat exists between 2pm and 7pm Tuesday.


HAZARDS & IMPACTS




- A Marginal Risk for severe thunderstorms exists for Tuesday afternoon and evening.
- Thunderstorm winds could be strong enough to blow down trees and power poles.
 Power outages likely where severe storms occur.
- Heavy rainfall with localized flash flooding is also possible. No river flooding is expected.
- Similar temperatures to today with higher humidity will push heat indices in the lower 90s south of the mountains and the mid 90s across SE New Hampshire.
- Very Warm and humid conditions will continue for much of the week.
