



Significant Storm Expected Saturday

March 22, 2024

OVERVIEW

- Heavy snow expected across the mountains and foothills, possibly onto portions of the coastal plain. Snow changing to rain along the coast and southern NH with a wintry mix inland from the coast. Minor flooding possible at the coast and southeasternmost NH. This system has trended slightly east and colder.

TIMING

- Precipitation begins as snow later tonight, changing to rain along the coast and a mix into the foothills. Precipitation comes to an end Saturday night.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Significant snowfall accumulations in excess of 8 inches are possible across the mountains and foothills of NH and western ME.
- A mix of snow, sleet, and freezing rain likely across central NH and the foothills of Maine to the interior portion of the coastal plain. This includes the Monadnocks of NH as well where icing will likely occur. There will be likely be a narrow belt of wet snow which could result in outages.
- Heavy rain possible at the coast and across southernmost NH on Saturday. Some flooding impacts are possible.
- Wind gusts increase to 30 to 35 MPH Saturday night into early Sunday as the storm is departing.
- No significant coastal flooding is expected.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- A flood watch has been issued for southeasternmost NH and the coastline of maine where 1-2 inches of rain may quickly run off.
