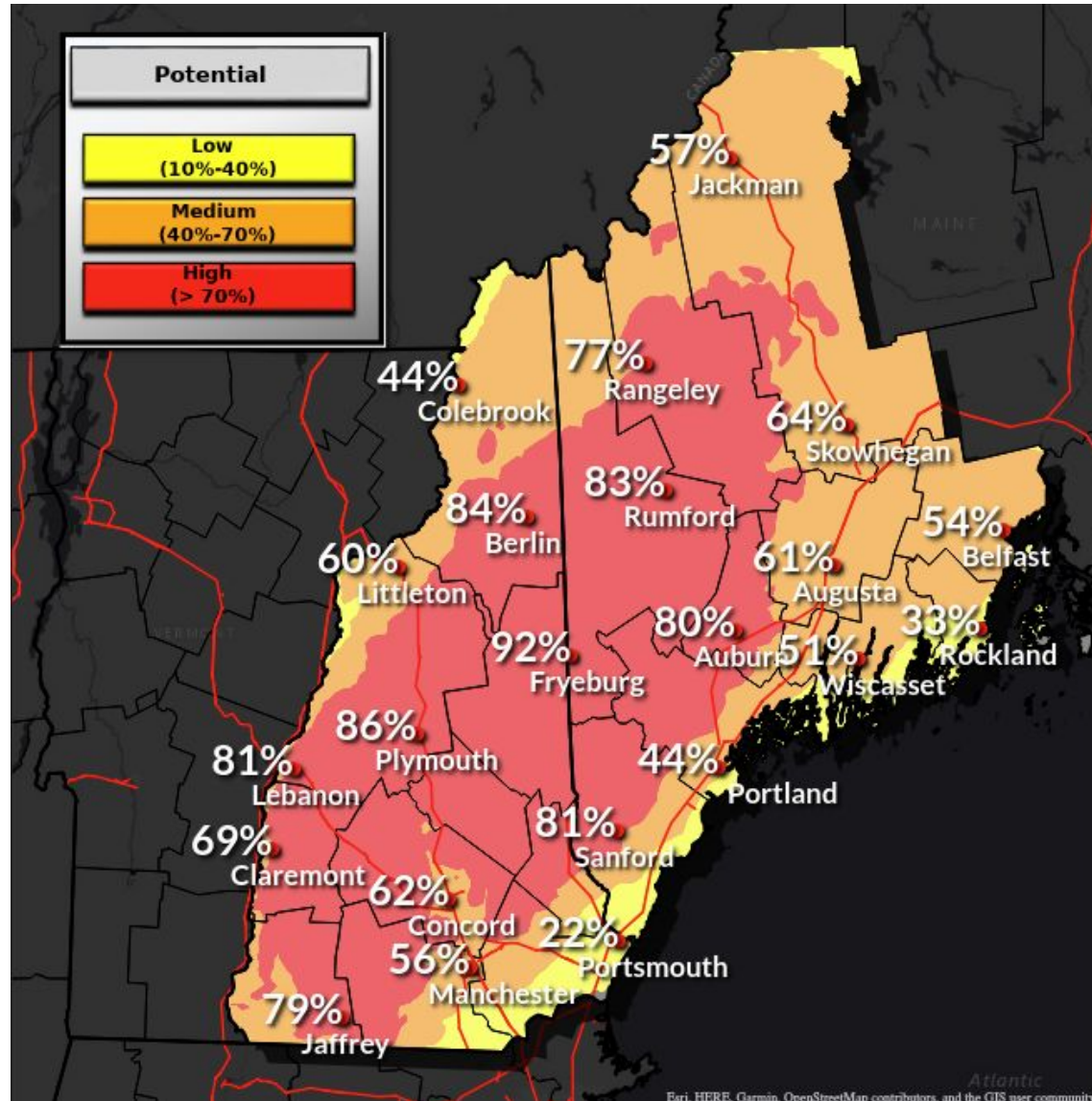




## Probability For At Least 6 Inches of Snow

## What To Expect



Cloudier today and Tuesday, remaining mild and dry.

Complex storm system approaches Wednesday, will have the most impact Wednesday night into Thursday.

- ✓ Accumulating snow likely with heavy accumulations possible.
- ✓ Heaviest precipitation rates Wednesday night and Thursday morning. Sleet not out of the question at times in southern NH and coastal ME.
- ✓ Snow may be on the wet/heavy side especially south of the mountains and on the coast. This could cause power outages.
- ✓ Gusty to damaging winds toward the coast and over the coastal waters.
- ✓ Minor coastal flooding and splash-over possible.
- ✓ Depending on track of the storm, snow amounts, and snow water content, moderate to major impacts will be possible in terms of snowfall rates, amounts, and snow load (weight).

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
