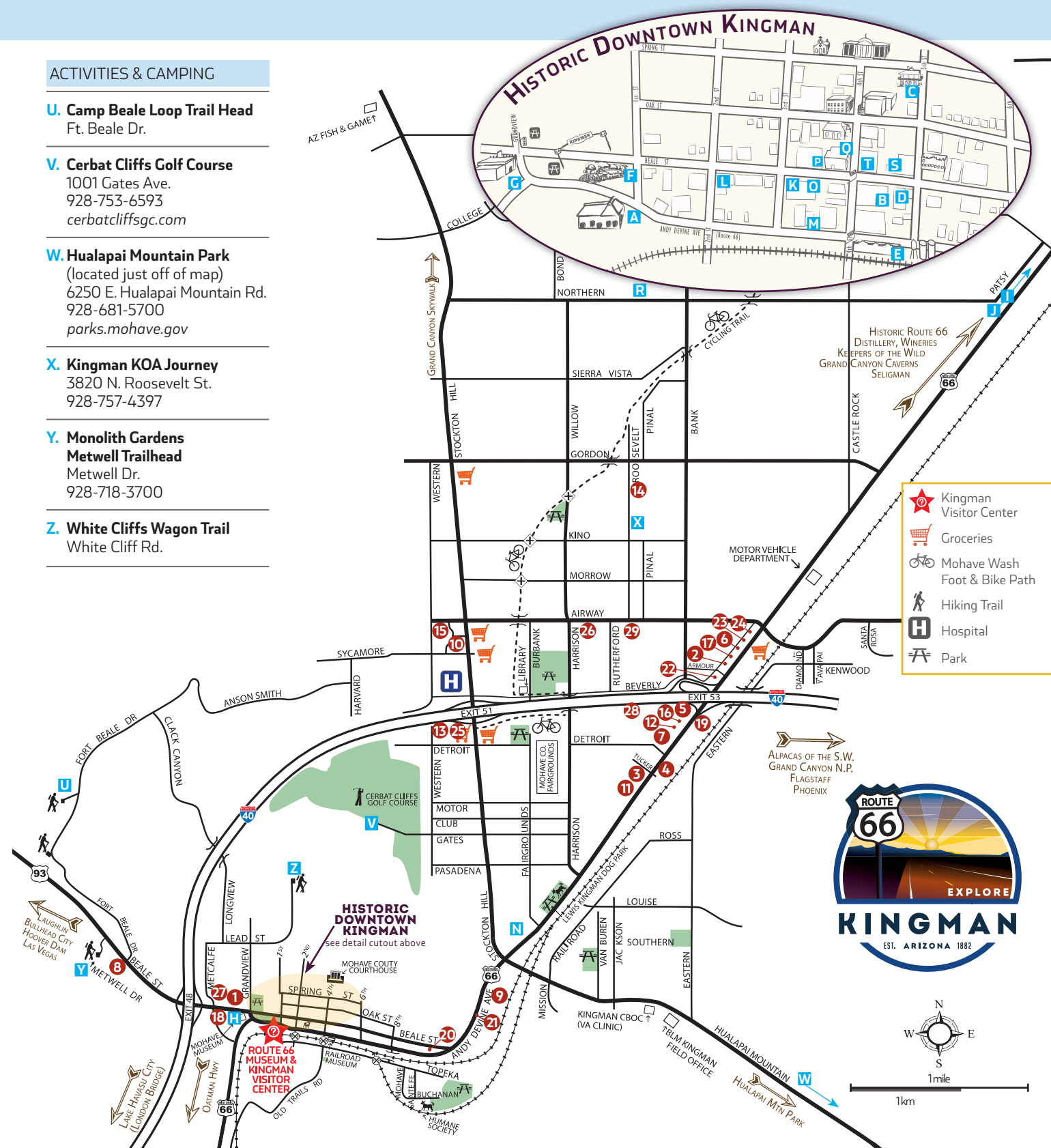

Give into your current craving—whether it's classic diner fare, savory Mexican cuisine, something light and fresh or just a great cup of Joe—because it's all on hand in Kingman. There's no shortage of familiar restaurant chain options, but the locally owned restaurants set Kingman apart on your travels. **Rutherford's 66 Family Diner** and **Kingman Healthy Bar** are just two of the only-found-here restaurants, and **Desert Diamond Distillery** and **Cella Wine & Hive Five Meadery** are visitor experiences in their own right. With so many different local favorites to try, you'll want to plan breakfast, lunch and dinner here!

Get "King-sized" Kicks on Route 66

The stories, songs, photos and writings that Route 66 has inspired since it was declared in 1926 are too many to count, but you can create your own story right here in Kingman. The city is in the heart of the longest contiguous stretch (158 miles) of the Old Mother Road. In this area you can see and feel the vibes of Route 66's heyday, and head eastward or westward to encounter everything from historic mines to vast marshes, iconic service stations to boardwalk shops, famed locomotives to ghost towns. History buffs, Americana lovers, foodies, thrill seekers – truly anyone and everyone – will find something to bring the unmatched lure of this road to life.

Explore and Adventure in the Rugged Outdoors

No matter your preferred mode of transportation – offroad vehicles, horses, bikes or your own paces – the Kingman region is your playground! In and near Kingman, and on easy day trips from the city, you can visit Arizona's oldest inhabited town, hunt for petroglyphs, explore vast trail systems and catch both mountain and Colorado River views. If you're wild for wildlife, get ready for infamous burros, mighty elk, wooly alpacas and even jungle creatures, too! The bonus is that most of these experiences are available year-round.



Choose your own outdoor adventure:

Alpacas of the Southwest (a kid-friendly ranch) | **Arizona Peace Trail** (a 750-mile OHV loop) | **White Cliffs Wagon Trail** (walk along wagon ruts from the 1800s) | **Cerbat Foothills Recreation Area** (extensive trail system) | **Chloride, Ariz.** (oldest continuously inhabited mining town) | **Hualapai Mountain Park** (a beautiful sky island) | **Monolith Garden Trail** (loop trails through volcanic rock formations) | **Oatman, Ariz.** (home to more burros than people!) | **Keepers of the Wild** (a wildlife sanctuary)
